January's BIRTHSTONE

Garnets:

Can be found in a variety of colors including red, orange, yellow, green, purple,

brown, blue, black, pink and colorless. India leads the world in the production of garnet; in 2011, it produced an estimated 700000 metric tonnes. The second-largest garnet producing nation in the world is China with an annual production of 470000 metric tonnes. The third place is occupied us here in Australia (150000 metric tonnes) followed by the United States (54000 metric tonnes).

Russia and Turkey also produce large amounts of industrial garnet, but they are not yet exporting much of this material to my knowledge.



Garnets are believed to prevent nightmares and being bitten by snakes (?????)

and can provide directional guidance in darkness. Wearers may see an increase in their self-image, will power and energy levels, and the nervous may feel calmer. Other garnet attributes are faith, love and constancy.

Amethyst: It was believed by the ancient Greeks and Romans to ward off the intoxicating powers of the God of grape harvest, Ritual Madness—Bacchus.

It is a beautiful purple stone associated with sincerity, peace of mind and good health. Amethyst is a purple quartz, a beautiful blend of violet and red that can found in every corner of the earth. Historically, the finest amethyst were found in Russia and were featured in much of the Royal European jewelry. Today, while Brazil is the primary source of this gemstone, fine material can be found elsewhere, especially in Zambia.

Amethyst is a symbol of protection and has the power to overcome difficulty. It also encourages self control and strengthens the bond in a love relationship.

Amethyst is also believed to have great mystical qualities and it can help to steady a restless mind and bring mental and emotional well-being. It also can bring intuition, motivation and sincerity. And can aid in meditation and stabilizes harsh emotions



Worlds biggest Amethyst Geode – The 'Empress of Uruguay' – can be found in the Atherton Tablelands, Cairns, Australia. It stands three metres tall (that's eleven feet) and weighing two and a half tones. It is worth a trip to see her if you are up that way.



Table of Grit, Mesh and Micron Conversion

I don't claim to be an expert in this subject, but I did need to get across it when setting up my workshop at home and wanting to order supplies from China in particular. Some members have asked about this subject, so a reference table (with some rounding errors) is included in this edition of Snippets.

Loosely, if it is affixed to something (e.g. a disc or a wheel) it will be measured in grit. That said, Chinese suppliers commonly use the expression "mesh" when we would normally call it "grit" size. Diamond powder or paste is normally quoted in microns, as are polishing powders such as the various oxides. Other powders may be quoted in either grit or microns, but grit seems to be the more common.

If you have any further questions, please consult an expert.
